Chepang shelter project, Lamjung

The Chepang community is a nomadic tribe in Nepal, hunting, foraging for wild plants, fishing and jungle farming is their primary lifestyle. In more recent years they have been encouraged to settle into small communities and live a more settled and modern lifestyle. MSH Nepal built two family shelters in Chitti, Lamjung in one of such communities. All costs for building these shelters were paid for by MSH Nepal and day meals were also provided to the laborers.

Support to Marybert Orphanage, Nepal – Project

Marybert School & Orphanage was started in 2002 with the motto of providing education to children who are poor, deprived, abandoned or orphaned. This year we undertook a refurbishment project to improve conditions at the Orphanage.

Key areas of focus were to;

- Improve the physical infrastructure and facilities of school.
- Repair of the main school building and painting.
- 8 classrooms were furnished with carpets.
- 3 new Montessori classrooms were established and 1 play room for Montessori children.
- All the classrooms were equipped with white boards and two blue boards.
- A new reception counter was setup along with an accounts section equipped with accounting materials.
- Inverters were also installed for power backup.
- 3 branded computers were given to the school
- Provided printed promotional materials like calendars and brochures to attract paying students
- Conducted a teacher training workshop
- Designed and launched a website for Marybert School
- 3 dormitories were refurbished with new bedding materials.

Sarita Magar Medical Treatment

Sarita Magar is one of the children whom My Small Help, Nepal have been supporting since 2009. In August 2014, she started to have severe bouts headache. After she fainted during one of such bout, she was hospitalized. After an MRI scan, doctors diagnosed her with "hydrocephalus" a condition where a small pocket of water is formed in the brain. The doctors informed us that the situation was not life threatening and that a minor surgery to remove the water pocket will be necessary. MSH Nepal provided for 50% of all the hospital bills. Sarita has now fully recovered and doing well in her studies.

A project for single mother Bindu

Bindu Balami is 34 years old single mother of 2 children Nabin and Nabina Balami. Both children are sponsored through My Small Help, Nepal for their education. Bindu

used to work as labor mostly in house construction. She hardly earns Rs. 200 (1.68p) a day which is just enough for her family to eat. Bindu wanted to set up her own small business by opening grocery and eatery shop. She approached us with the idea. We were very positive about her determination to do something of her own to support her family. The money she earns from her business will help to secure her children's future. The overall project cost around £435. We visited her shop and it is doing well for her. She is happy that her shop is doing well.

Shee Mangaladevi School, Dhrumthali, Sindupalchowk Re-painting and water supply

In 2012 we built a school block of 4 classes in Shree Mangladevi School in Sindhupalchowk. The school had no drinking water facilities for the students and in 2014 MSH Nepal helped the school in setting up a drinking water supply for the students. MSH Nepal also repainted the school block that was built by us.

We are very happy to inform that Anjali Thapa Magar has secured 84% in her grade 12 exams and has received a scholarship for the first year in her college for bachelors program. MSH Nepal has been sponsoring Anjali since 2007. Another student Kalpana Chaudhary has also passed in her grade 12 exams and has joined college for her bachelors program. Kalpana has been with MSH Nepal since 2010.
